 1. Describe your personal faith and Christian experience, including what you consider to be the most significant implications of your faith commitments?
 2. State your understanding of the relationship of biblical perspectives and faith commitments to your scholarly discipline.
 3. Provide a statement of your teaching philosophy, and how it relates to instruction in the undergraduate liberal arts core of a Christ-centered university.

Documents Required for Semi-finalist Candidates:

- Official Transcripts
- 3 Professional References, including complete contact information and statement of relationship to candidate.
- Evidence of experience and excellence in teaching. (Student evaluations, letter of recommendation, etc.)
- A signed [statement of faith](#) and community covenant.

General Job Description:

- Instruct and facilitate meaningful learning of the course material.
- Provide timely feedback/ grades to students and University Registrar.
- Maintain regular office hours.

Knowledge and Skills Requirement

- A Christian faith and support for Johnson University's mission and values.
- M.A. in English, Rhetoric/Composition, or related field
